### **Purpose of This Book**

This book is designed to help nail specialist students in Florida understand the laws and rules that govern their profession. It is based on the **Florida Statutes**, **Chapter 477** (Cosmetology) and the **Florida Administrative Code**, **Chapter 61G5**.

While the official statutes and rules are written in legal language, this guide explains them in **plain English**, with examples and notes, so students can clearly understand what is required before, during, and after licensure.

### The purpose is threefold:

- 1. **Education** To ensure every student is prepared for exams and safe professional practice.
- 2. **Compliance** To prevent violations by knowing both the rules *and the penalties*.
- 3. **Professionalism** To build confidence and credibility as a licensed nail specialist in Florida.

### How to Use This Guide

- **Study for Exams** Use this book alongside your nail technology curriculum. Questions on the midterm and final exams will come directly from these laws and rules.
- **Understand Penalties** Each section outlines *not only the requirements, but also the consequences* if those rules are ignored. Many violations occur because nail specialists underestimate the penalties.

• **Reference in Practice** – Keep this book as a quick reference in your professional career. Knowing the law helps protect both you and your clients.

## Eligibility for a Nail Specialist License

To qualify for a Nail Specialist license in Florida, applicants must:

- Complete a minimum of 180 hours of training in a licensed nail or cosmetology school. (F.S. §477.019)
- Be at least 16 years old, or have earned a high school diploma or its equivalent. (F.S. §477.019(2))
- Complete a **Board-approved 4-hour HIV/AIDS course** before submitting their application. (FAC 61G5-32.001)
- Submit a complete application and fee to the **Department of Business & Professional Regulation (DBPR)**.

### **Application Process**

- 1. Finish all required training hours at a Florida-licensed school.
- 2. Successfully complete the 4-hour HIV/AIDS pre-licensure course.
- 3. Submit the Nail Specialist License Application to DBPR, including:
  - Proof of completed training hours.
  - o Proof of HIV/AIDS course completion.
  - o Required application fee.
- 4. Receive the official **license** issued by DBPR once approved.

## **License Display Requirement**

- Once issued, a Nail Specialist license must be **displayed in public view at the workstation or reception area**. (FAC 61G5-20.007)
- Failure to properly display a license may result in a fine.

### **Practicing Without a License**

Practicing nail technology without a valid license is a serious violation.

- **Penalty**: It is considered a **misdemeanor criminal offense** and may result in **fines** up to \$5,000 per violation. (F.S. §477.0265; F.S. §477.028)
- Repeat offenders may also face **suspension of future licensure eligibility**.

### **Key Takeaways for Students**

- You **cannot practice or take clients** until DBPR approves your application and issues your license.
- Even if you "know how" from prior experience, working without a license can lead to fines, criminal charges, and loss of future career opportunities.
- Displaying your license is just as important as earning it inspectors will check this first.



## **Renewal Cycle**

- Florida Nail Specialist licenses must be **renewed every two years (biennially)**. (F.S. §477.0201)
- The renewal deadline is set by DBPR and is the same for all licensees in the cycle.
- Renewal requires payment of the renewal fee to DBPR.

### **Continuing Education (CEU) Requirements**

To renew a license, Nail Specialists must complete a **Board-approved CEU program** that includes:

- **HIV/AIDS Update** (1 hour)
- **Sanitation & Safety** (minimum 2 hours)
- Florida Laws & Rules (2 hours)
- Additional subjects as determined by DBPR or the Board of Cosmetology

(FAC 61G5-32.001, 61G5-22.009)

⚠ Note: The HIV/AIDS course must be completed **before initial licensure** and again as part of continuing education.
